2008 YEAR-END FINAL REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF OTC PROGRAMS COVERING ALL ACTIVITIES FROM JANUARY TO DECEMBER 2008

A. ORGANIZATION AND MANAGEMENT

- During the first half of the year the basic financial administrative procedures were established and staff assignments made:
- Geneva team with Executive Director and 3 staff (2 part-time)
- TCI-based team with 3 staff
- Cost center in Zuchwil with 3 part-time staff
- All staff contracts completed and signed
- Official OTC Website launched in June covering all program areas
- Monthly Updates issued to inform Chapters about program developments
- Services of travel agent HRG Switzerland contracted for use by surgeons
- Routine financial and expenditure reporting between the 3 OTC locations established
- All surgeon contracts, with some additional ones for course faculty, issued and signed
- First audit of cost center by Grantor (Stryker) conducted in July

During the second half of the year the management and staff structure was streamlined to achieve a comprehensive team commensurate with program needs and budgetary realities:

- TCI-based team reduced to 2 staff
- Geneva team with director and 2 part-time staff
- Weekly reporting on surgeon contracts and education events introduced
- Regular program management meetings held in Nice and Zuchwil
- Second audit of cost center by Grantor (Stryker) conducted in November
- Departure of the Executive Director by the end of the year

OTC program activities were undertaken in accordance with the Budget Grant 2008 document. A synoptic overview is given in ANNEX 1. Most of the program activities were executed as requested.

B. GOVERNANCE AND LEADERSHIP

Executive Committee - The Executive Committee (ExCo), together with the Board of Trustees, held three meetings in 2008:

- First meeting prior to the ITS Barcelona in April 2008
- Second meeting in June 2008 prior to the AGM/LF in Nice
- Third meeting in Paris in November 2008

Program Oversight Committee (POC) - was cancelled and members assigned to other committees.

Chapter Relations - Relations with OTC Chapters and other countries was as major focus of OTC from the beginning, including the *Import-the-Expert* and *Humanitarian* programs:

- Expert visit to Belgium in January 2008
- East-Meets-West Symposium in May 2008 at Dubrovnik, Croatia, with 4 OTC surgeon experts attending
- Expert visit to Kiev, Ukraine for OTC-Russia sponsored event
- 2 Humanitarian missions completed to India, one to Africa (Italy Chapter), and one to Nepal
- Meetings of Scandinavian surgeons were attended by OTC staff
- A total of 10 OTC Chapter meetings at TCI were assisted by OTC staff in Nice (see attached ANNEX 2)
- Liaison with 19 existing country Chapters were maintained, and 10 new Chapters are at various stages of formation (see attached ANNEX 3)

C. <u>EDUCATION PROGRAM</u>

Education Committee (EdCo):

- Committee expanded to 3 with addition of E. Guerado (Spain) joining G. Bowyer (UK, Chair) and F. Stockmans (Belgium).
- 2 Meetings held, 1st in June at AGM/LF and 2nd in Paris, 13 September.
- Strategy Paper submitted to ExCo Education Liaison M. Rosenwasser

Surgeon and Nurses Courses:

Leadership Forum

 Held in Nice, 27-28 June 2008; chaired by Prof. Emil Schemitsch and focused on Polytrauma, Upper Extremity Trauma and Periprosthetic Fractures; 98 delegates

International Trauma Symposia (ITS)

- 3 held in 2008 with direct Stryker sponsorship
- 1st in Sydney, Australia in January 2008
- 2nd in Barcelona, Spain in April 2008
- 3rd in Hollywood, Florida, in September 2008

- April 14-15, Orthobiologics (28; Supported by Stryker Biotech Grant)
- June 5-6, Polytrauma (12)
- June 12-14, Foot and Ankle (28)

- 1 under contract in Strasbourg in cooperation with AIOD, 3-5 December 2008

Senior Faculty Forum

• June 25-26 with 7 Surgeons from OTC Chapters

Fragility Fractures Forum

• One Forum held at ITS Barcelona

Hyperguide and Education Resources

- Planning meetings held in Mahwah, December 2007, at ITS Barcelona, April 2008, and in Nice, June 2008, in conjunction with the Senior Faculty Forum, and in New York in December 2008
- Design of a Roadmap for preparing indication-based inputs to the Hyperguide, to be implemented starting early 2009
- Negotiations with Vindico concluded successfully to include OTC-branded contributions from the surgeon course and Leadership Forum faculty into the trauma section of the Hyperguide
- Image Database and OP techniques are being derived from existing material, and then incorporated into the OTC website (indication-based entry points already available in website), initiated during second half of 2008

Education Fellowship Program

- Ten Fellowship applications received and most evaluated by Chairman
- Five Fellowships completed (Croatian to NY, 2 Brazilians to Strasbourg, and 2 Indians to Murnau)
- Five Fellowships approved for 2009
- Umbrella agreement with host center Murnau concluded, including standard procedures and cost coverage mechanism

D. PUBLICATION PROGRAM

Clinical Research Books

 First book completed and published in December 2008: "Clinical Research for Surgeons", edited by Mohit Bhandari and Anders Joensson; 1'200 free copies received by OTC for distribution to interested surgeons and in support of training courses

Journal of Orthopaedic Trauma (JOT)

- Negotiations have been completed with JOT publisher to obtain subscriptions at reduced price for all interested OTC surgeons
- Agreement has been reached to include an OTC supplement in the JOT issue December 2009, and a contract with the OTC editors signed

E. RESEARCH PROGRAM

Closer collaboration between the three programs (basic research, biomechanical research, clinical research) was initiated to create synergies and economies of scale.

Research Committee (ReCo):

- Meetings were held in San Francisco, March 2008, and in Nice, June 2008, and in Amsterdam, November 2008
- Expansion of the ReCo to include the chairmen of biomechanical and clinical research, now totaling 9 members, and incorporating biomechanical research grants into the ReCo process
- Grants 2008 awarded: 7 research grants, and 4 Young Investigator Grants
- Flyer presenting all grants awarded since 2005 was produced and distributed at AGM/LF 2008, also included into OTC Website
- Preproposal applications for 2009 grants received: 42 for research grants, and 6 for young investigator grants
- Total of 18 full proposals for 2009 was received; they were evaluated and rated at the Amsterdam meeting
- Grants for 2009 awarded: 8 research grants, and 3 Young Investigators grants
- One grantee presentation on a completed study was given at the AGM 2008

OTC Course on "The Principles and Practice of Clinical Research" was held in Amsterdam, April 2008, with about fifty participants and faculty.

OTC Symposium on "Biomechanics of Locked Plating Revisited" was held at TCI, Nice, in May 2008, with 18 participants.

Biomechanical Research Fellowships were awarded to 3 fellows. One Clinical Research Fellowships was awarded in 2008.
